Emergency Preparedness for Vacation Rental Owners and Guests:

Your visitors may not know where to go, who to contact or what to do if there is an emergency while they are on Hornby. It is good practice to have both an emergency kit and/or 'grab and go bag' as well as easy to find information about emergency procedures and locations on Hornby.

We have worked with the Hornby Island Residents and Ratepayers Association, Emergency Preparedness Committee (HIRRA EPC) to develop this guide to support you in ensuring your guests can be prepared if an emergency happens.

To do this we suggest that you have an 'In An Emergency' section in the guide you provide to your Guests. It can include:


1. The location and contents of the emergency kit and go bag for the house.




It may also be useful to inform guests they should have their own 'go bag' with items for their unique specific needs (personal medications, pet food, etc.) in case of an emergency requires them to leave in an emergency.



Grab and Go Bag! A grab-and-go bag is a small emergency kit that's easy to take with you, in case you need to leave right away. It's a good idea to make grab-and-go bags for your home, workplace and vehicle. · Food (ready to eat) and water Phone charger and battery bank · Small battery-powered or hand-crank radio · Battery-powered or hand-crank flashlight Small first-aid kit and personal medications · Personal toiletries and items, such as an extra pair of glasses or contact lenses · Copy of your emergency plan · Copies of important documents, such as insurance papers and identification · Cash in small bills · Local map with your family meeting place identified Seasonal clothing and an emergency blanket · Pen and notepad · Pet food and any medications for your pets

- Where local information will be broadcast (local Hornby radio CFHR 96.5 FM and/or CBC 690 AM or 92.5 FM)

Along with this you may also want to ensure you have:

- 1. A well-stocked first aid kit both in the house and in a 'grab and go' bag/emergency kit
- 2. Water filtration tools (like LifeStraw's, water purification tablets or other portable filters)
- 3. Fire extinguishers in the kitchen and with any propane appliances (such as BBQ's and heaters)
- 4. A list of who to call in the event of an emergency, and where to get supplies. Ensure the following emergency and local service information, as well as your contact information is readily visible.

Display prominently the address for the house, and local contact person for the accommodation:

- Non-emergency Fire Department 250-335-2611

- Non-emergency medical advice 811
- Recycling Depot 250-335-0550
